

**DECEMBER 15, 2014 PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES  
CITY OF EDGERTON**

Chris Wellnitz called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m. Committee members present were Dave Thomas, Chris Wellnitz, and Matt McIntyre. **APPROVAL OF PUBLIC SAFETY MINUTES:**

A McIntyre/Thomas motion to approve the October 20, 2014 Public Safety Committee meeting minutes passed, all voted in favor.

**DISCUSS AND CONSIDER EMERGENCY RESPONSE PLAN:**

Klubertanz stated that the emergency response plan is a draft to look over and make any changes or updates that are needed. This will be discussed at next Public Safety Meeting.

**DISCUSS AND CONSIDER AMENDMENT TO CHAPTER 29 “REGULATION OF ANIMALS”, SECTION 29.07 “ANIMAL IMPOUNDMENT.”:**

The recommendation to amend how to deal with cats without identification. A McIntyre/Wellnitz motion to amend Chapter 29 “Regulation of Animals”, Section 29.07 “Animal Impoundment”, passed all voted in favor.

**POLICE CHIEF REPORT:**

Klubertanz stated that the Police Department investigated threats at the Edgerton Middle School. Officers also responded to an armed subject on Marlboro Ave which ended without incident. There have been a number of reports of theft from vehicles and the cases still remain open.
