**MAY 1, 2017 PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES
CITY OF EDGERTON**

Matt McIntyre called the meeting to order at 6:15 p.m. Committee members present were Matt McIntyre, and Paul Davis. Jonathon Frey was absent. Also present were Police Chief Tom Klubertanz, City Administrator Ramona Flanigan, and Clerk/Treasurer Cindy Hegglund.

ELECT CHAIR:

Davis nominated Matt McIntyre. McIntyre seconded. Hearing no other nominations the motion to elect McIntyre as chair passed, all voted in favor.

Klubertanz confirmed the agendas were properly posted on Friday, April 28, 2017 at the Post Office, Edgerton Library and City Hall.

APPROVAL OF PUBLIC SAFETY MINUTES:

A Davis/McIntyre motion to approve the March 6, 2017 Public Safety Committee meeting minutes passed, all voted in favor.

POLICE CHIEF REPORT:

Klubertanz stated the total calls for the year are 3,969 which is up from last year's total of 3,325.

Klubertanz also stated that Edgerton was chosen to host National Night Out which is a county wide event. All of the surrounding agencies participate in the event.

Being no other business before the Public Safety Committee, a McIntyre/Davis motion to adjourn passed, all voted in favor.

I bring this forward for discussion, and to see if this is a project the City wishes to pursue. I feel it is important and have been pursuing this for a number of years. I feel that it is important for the Police Department to continue to function at full capacity in case of any power outage.

In 2016(?), a request for a generator for the Police Department was requested due to multiple power outages over the previous year. \$6000.00 was initially budgeted, however it was felt that there should be more research into what was needed. The budget for 2017 includes \$27,766.00 for the purchase of a generator.

After being able to only obtain one bid, it was proposed at 2016 pricing, at \$34,916.00. The finance committee felt this bid was too high and more research was needed. The City engineers were requested to look into this and have estimated \$48,000.00.

I have not asked for a re-quote from the initial vendor. I did not want to waste his time if this was not a project the City wanted to pursue.

Our estimate totaled about \$48,000 as detailed in the attached. The proposal from the contractor that the Chief spoke with was dated July 2016. When I spoke with him, his cost did not include gas piping/metering and would need to be re-quoted for 2017 pricing which I have not seen yet. I think the \$48,000 cost would be a good budget number for now.

Mona,

I understand from our electrical engineers that providing power to select computers and light circuits within a PD building is not a common approach but is a possibility. I also spoke with Randy, Fire Chief, and he has seen this before and generally would be OK with this. We and/or the Fire Chief would need to check the battery packs for the emergency lights and egress lights and decide if these would need to be included for generator power. For this to work then, the selected circuits would need to be routed through conduits containing only those for generator power. These would be colored with red plates so everyone knows where these are. With a small generator for these needs, the generator could be sized and depending on the size, could be a much less expensive air-cooled residential type unit powered with natural gas which may be able to be set in a number of different locations.

For this option then you would have a cost for the generator unit, some electrical work in the building and a natural gas hookup. This would be less expensive however than the full building standby power option. Hope this helps. Let me know where you think this may go from here. Thanks, Dave

Scope of Work: Add a natural gas standby generator with automatic transfer switch to the existing electric service of the Police Department building. This generator installation will be an optional standby system as defined by NEC Article 702 Optional Standby Systems. The generator will provide full power backup of the entire building. The location of the generator will be on grade in a location determined by the code required clearances. An existing parking space on the east side of the building may need to be utilized for the generator. The existing service enters the building below grade directly into the electrical room. The service is fed from two pole mounted utility transformers located on the south east corner of the building. The meter socket is located inside the electrical room. The electrical room is full and there is no room to mount a new transfer switch. In order to add a new automatic transfer the location of the service entrance will have to be re-located to the same areas as the new transfer switch. This will require a new underground meter pedestal for the utility metering. The new meter pedestal will be located on the east exterior wall near the utility pole. The new transfer switch will be mounted inside the building in the garage. The transfer switch will be service entrance rated. The new meter pedestal and transfer switch will be mounted back-to-back. A new main feeder will have to be installed from the transfer switch back the existing main panel.

Since there will only be one transfer switch the emergency egress lighting will have to be battery powered (independent backup power source from the generator) per NEC Article 700 Emergency Systems. This building does not currently have battery powered egress lighting. The local AHJ will have to determine if additional battery powered egress lights are required for this building.

Existing Electric Service: 200 amp, 120/208 volt, single phase, 3 wire. The existing maximum demand on the electric service was not available from Alliant Energy for this service.

Proposed Generator: 30kW natural gas, radiator cooled, exterior pad mounted, quiet site (sound attenuating) outdoor enclosure. \$35,000

Service Entrance Rated Automatic Transfer Switch: 150 amp 2-pole (with 200 amp 2-pole main circuit breaker), NEMA 1. \$10,000

New 200A Single Phase Meter Pedestal: \$1,000

New 200A Feeder From Transfer Switch to Existing Main Electrical Panel: \$2,000

Public Safety Meeting

June, 2017

For the month of May, there were 1050 calls for service. This brings the total for the year to 5538, compared to 4715 for the same period last year.

CALLS FOR SERVICE

Edgerton Officers responded to 1050 calls for service. A brief summary of these calls; Disorderly Conduct 9; Domestic Disturbance 0; Animal complaints 9; Burglary 0; Fire Assists 25; Assist Other 24; and Assist Citizen 64; traffic stops 133.

ENFORCEMENT ACTIVITY

During this time period, Officers conducted 133 traffic stops. Officers investigated 2 reports of overdose, and 5 traffic accidents along with 19 calls for suspicious activity.

DRE activity has increased as outside agencies are using this on a more regular basis.

PROACTIVE

Officers continue to work with SIU. Edgerton has 3 Officers involved with 24 hours generally scheduled each week. They have been involved in search warrants and continue investigations throughout Rock County.

8 People Arrested After Search Warrants Executed

On May 2nd, 2017 the Rock County Sheriff's Office Special Investigations Unit with assistance from the Safe Streets Task Force (GROC) served two search warrants in the City of Beloit. The City of Beloit Police Department and the Beloit Township Police Department also assisted with the transport individuals after they were taken into custody. The first warrant was served in the 1300 block of Broad St. and the second was served in the 1700 block of Wisconsin Ave. The search warrants were executed as part of an ongoing investigation into the manufacturing and delivery of Crack Cocaine.

At the conclusion of the two searches, approximately 100 grams of Crack Cocaine, over \$2000.00 and numerous items of paraphernalia were seized. In total, eight individuals were taken into custody during these operations. Listed below are the names and charges for the individuals arrested.

On May 11th, 2017 the Rock County Sheriff's Office SWAT Team, the Rock County Special Investigations Unit and the FBI Safe Streets Task Force (GROC) executed a search warrant in the 1200 block of Cleveland St. in the City of Beloit. The search warrant was executed as part of an ongoing investigation into the delivery of Marijuana in the immediate area.

At the conclusion of the search, approximately 86 grams of Marijuana, \$9,900.00 in cash and numerous items of paraphernalia were seized. The subject taken into custody at the time of execution of the warrant has been identified as Karl A. Saladino (19 years old). He has been charged with Possession with Intent to Deliver THC less than 200 g, Manufacture/Deliver THC less than 200 g (2 counts), Prohibited Acts B, Possession of Drug Paraphernalia and a Probation Violation.
