**JUNE 19, 2017 PUBLIC SAFETY COMMITTEE MEETING MINUTES  
CITY OF EDGERTON**

Matt McIntyre called the meeting to order at 6:15 p.m. Committee members present were Matt McIntyre, and Paul Davis. Jonathon Frey was absent. Also present were Police Chief Tom Klubertanz, City Administrator Ramona Flanigan, Mayor Chris Lund, Alderperson Mark Wellnitz, Public Works Director Tom Hartzell, and a representative from the Edgerton Reporter.

Klubertanz confirmed the agendas were properly posted on Friday, June 16, 2017 at the Post Office, Edgerton Library and City Hall.

**APPROVAL OF PUBLIC SAFETY MINUTES:**

A Davis/McIntyre motion to approve the May 1, 2017 Public Safety Committee meeting minutes passed, all voted in favor.

**DISCUSS GENERATOR FOR POLICE DEPARTMENT:**

Klubertanz stated that the Police department is in need of a full generator. He stated that it would not be beneficial to purchase a partial generator that would only allow the lights to stay on. They would need a full generator in order to keep the department fully functioning.

A Davis/McIntyre motion to pursue the discussion of a full generator at the next Finance meeting passed on a 2/0 roll call vote.

**POLICE CHIEF REPORT:**

Chief Klubertanz reviewed the service call numbers that were provided in the packet.

Klubertanz also stated that the Annual Awards dinner was held and those awarded were; Lieutenant Vierck, Officer Kanable, and Meagan Farrell.

Being no other business before the Public Safety Committee, a McIntyre/Davis motion to adjourn passed, all voted in favor.

# *Public Safety*

## *2017 Review*

The year 2017 ended with a total of 12,956 calls for service, which is down from 2016 12,003 and approaching 2015 totals of 13,874. Several cases remain under investigation as Officers continue to follow-up with these incidents.

A summary of 2017:

Officers conducted 1345 traffic stops.

Officers issued 354 citations which were referred to Municipal Court.

Officers issued 56 citations which were referred to Circuit Court.

The department referred 86 criminal cases to circuit Court.

Office staff processed 723 vehicle registration transactions.

Officers handled 68 traffic accidents with 7 injuries.

The department was involved with the Coalition with several school informational functions. Also prescription drug round-ups and training through the coalition.

The department initiated a consortium with Rock County agencies to facilitate training opportunities. This has worked well, with training already beginning in 2018.

SIU remained active. Officers were involved in multiple investigations throughout the County, resulting in several search warrants.

An influx of thefts from motor vehicles occurred over the summer. The department moved to mandatory 12 hour shifts and officers working overtime on days off. We were also assisted by SIU members, conducting surveillance and patrols. This proactive measure resulted in provided information and resulted in the arrests of two adults, on multiple charges.

The internship program in conjunction with Blackhawk Tech College was conducted, with the intern receiving 200hrs of study.



On May 2nd, 2017 the Rock County Sheriff's Office Special Investigations Unit with assistance from the Safe Streets Task Force (GROC) served two search warrants in the City of Beloit. The City of Beloit Police Department and the Beloit Township Police Department also assisted with the transport individuals after they were taken into custody. The first warrant was served in the 1300 block of Broad St. and the second was served in the 1700 block of Wisconsin Ave. The search warrants were executed as part of an ongoing investigation into the manufacturing and delivery of Crack Cocaine.

At the conclusion of the two searches, approximately 100 grams of Crack Cocaine, over \$2000.00 and numerous items of paraphernalia were seized. In total, eight individuals were taken into custody during these operations. Listed below are the names and charges for the individuals arrested.



On May 11th, 2017 the Rock County Sheriff's Office SWAT Team, the Rock County Special Investigations Unit and the FBI Safe Streets Task Force (GROC) executed a search warrant in the 1200 block of Cleveland St. in the City of Beloit. The search warrant was executed as part of an ongoing investigation into the delivery of Marijuana in the immediate area.

At the conclusion of the search, approximately 86 grams of Marijuana, \$9,900.00 in cash and numerous items of paraphernalia were seized. The subject taken into custody at the time of execution of the warrant has been identified as Karl A. Saladino (19 years old). He has been charged with Possession with Intent to Deliver THC less than 200 g, Manufacture/Deliver THC less than 200 g (2 counts), Prohibited Acts B, Possession of Drug Paraphernalia and a Probation Violation.



On June 6th, 2017 the Rock County Sheriff's Office Special Investigations Unit and the FBI Safe Streets Task Force (GROC) executed a search warrant in the 1600 block of Sixth St. in the City of Beloit. The search warrant was executed as part of an ongoing investigation into the delivery of Heroin in the immediate area.

At the conclusion of the search, approximately 40 grams of Heroin, 16 grams of THC, \$1000.00 in cash and a 9mm handgun were seized. Two subjects were taken into custody in conjunction with this investigation and two others for outstanding warrants. The individuals arrested have been identified as Charreese M. Long (25 years old), Capresha S. Handley (22 years old) Marquavies K. Quince (21 years old) and Richard L. Fisher(26 years old). 



### Edgerton Police Department Drug Interdiction Deployment

On June 29, 2017, The Edgerton Police Department coordinated a 4 hour domestic highway enforcement deployment that was focused in the City of Edgerton. The focus of this deployment was to suppress violence by interrupting drug trafficking and other criminal activity associated with these types of crimes.

The Edgerton Police Department was joined in this initiative by officers from the Rock County Sheriff's Office Special Investigations Unit (SIU), Janesville PD Canine, Rock County Sheriff's Office Canine, Evansville PD, and patrol officers from the Edgerton Police Department.

These officers were able to make 17 citizen contacts. These contacts resulted in two drug arrests, five traffic citations; and 13 warnings.
