<u>River Road Bike Path or Sidewalk</u>: A resident requested we investigate the possibility of having a sidewalk or bike path on River Road. The road is narrow making it unsafe for pedestrians. The street is considered a collector as it serves as the only access for 100s of homes.

The City investigated the installation of a sidewalk or a multiuse path from Fulton Street to Diane Drive several years ago. Some of the obstacles at that time were cost and a policy about who would remove snow.

The timing to consider this project is good in that the bi-annual DOT TAP grant applications are open. The TAP program funds alternative transportation projects.
